Freedom for All Ireland (FFAI) is a vital program which helps bring the issues and challenges faced by the those living in the North of Ireland to our membership. At the forefront is the issue of justice for hundreds of families impacted by the death of loved ones during the Troubles, particularly those killed by the security forces or by paramilitaries where collusion with the State has been alleged or uncovered by independent research. Victim advocacy groups supported through the FFAI Christmas Appeal, such as Relatives for Justice and the Pat Finucane Center help families deal with this trauma. Others such as Cairde Strabane, Omagh Thunder Basketball Club, The Houben Center in Ardoyne and the St.Patrick's Center in Downpatrick provide programs to support their communities through peace and reconciliation programs, education and sport. I look forward to bringing you news from these groups on current and future programs as well as the impact that Brexit is expected to have on them. The FFAI Committee will work to review and address the resolutions passed at the convention and keep all of you informed. In addition, I will be scheduling quarterly virtual meetings with the State FFAI Chairs, so I ask that all State Presidents who have not appointed a FFAI Chairperson to please do so and send me their information. We need all your involvement and your support, whether it is by keeping Divisions informed at regular meetings, fundraising for the Christmas Appeal or attending events virtually and in person when it is safe to do so. Albany's Nina Pandolfo Honored with Ladies Ancient Order of Hibernians Junior Hibernian of the Year Award

The 2020 LAOH Junior Hibernian of the Year award was bestowed on Nina Pandolfo, age 11, of the Daughters of JFK of Division 1 in Albany, New York. The award was presented on July 25 by LAOH National President Karen Keane. Nina currently holds the dual positions of both Missions & Charities Officer and Catholic Action Officer.

The criteria for this national award include leadership ability, participation in all phases of her junior division, and exhibiting qualities of good manners, congeniality and wholesomeness.

Nina first exhibited the traits of "friendship, unity and Christian charity" when she was six-years-old and she singlehandedly organized a drive to collect Halloween costumes for underprivileged children in her community. She held a yard sale to raise money for her cause and requested donations of costumes from neighbors and friends. In the end, she donated 13 costumes to a local Albany Catholic school. It is now

an annual event.

Since that time, Nina has continued to do good deeds. As Catholic Action Officer in her junior division, she obtained rosary beads from Holy Family Ministries' Fr. Peyton's "Family Rosary Crusade" and distributed them to the members of her division. She also organized a collection of pop tabs from aluminum cans to raise money for the Ronald McDonald House to help families stay close to their children in the hospital.

Nina also is committed to feeding the hungry and is active in the local "Back Pack Program" to feed children who otherwise do not have enough food on weekends by filling back packs with food. She also has participated multiple times with the AOH and LAOH divisions in Albany to volunteer at the Regional Food Bank of Northeastern New York.

She serves as an usher at her church one Sunday a month for "Youth Sunday" and also takes up the collection and carries the gifts at the Offertory.

Nina also helps at events for LAOH JFK Division 1 in Albany by attending division events and setting up tables and chairs. She also has participated for several years with the division's annual baby shower for Community Maternity Services.

Cecilia Leonard and Delores Fitzgerald are Co-Honored with the 2020 LAOH's St. Brigid of Ireland Humanitarian Award

The prestigious St. Brigid of Ireland Humanitarian national award is bestowed biennially by the Ladies Ancient Order of Hibernians (LAOH) Inc. in recognition of extraordinary acts of humanitarianism. The award embodies the significant difference that the members of the Ladies Ancient Order of Hibernians, Inc. make in the lives of others, their community and church furthering their motto of friendship, unity and Christian Charity. The 2020 St. Brigid of Ireland Humanitarian award was bestowed on Cecilia Leonard of JFK Division 1 Albany, New York and Delores Fitzgerald of Dean Michael Barry Division 3 Oswego, New York. This is the first time in the history of the award, it has co-award winners.

To receive the St. Brigid of Ireland Humanitarian award a nominee must be a member in good standing of the LAOH and her contributions to the community must be of a humanitarian or civic nature. She must demonstrate qualities of compassion, kindness, understanding and respect for all human beings and promote Catholic action and the Hibernian spirit. Both women have met and exceeded all these criteria.

Cecilia has been a member of the LAOH for more than 40 years and has been elected to the office of president for both the division (JFK Division 1 Albany) and county (Albany County). She also has served as an appointee on the New York State Board for four presidents. Cecilia is a LAOH National Life Member and the secretary of the Trinity Degree Team.

She is one of eight children in a family that is involved in the Catholic Church and especially the missionary work of Father Peyton and his mission to bring families together into a prayerful life. Along with her brother, they organize a successful fundraiser for this organization every year. This event not only raises much needed funds for Holy Cross Family Ministries but also helps promote the works and canonization of

Father Peyton. She spends many hours discussing his work and mission with people but also encourages all to pray as a family. She brings a personal touch to his story and this has made thousands of people aware of his mission.

Another aspect of Cecilia is the work she performs for others. She can be found at the Hibernian Hall in the kitchen wearing an apron slicing vegetables, stirring a pot or sweeping the floor. She never refuses to "work in the trenches" and always has a smile on her face. She is consistently willing to help those in need. If she learns someone is sick, Cecilia will deliver food, bake brownies or send a card to let them know someone cares and is praying for their recovery. If she hears of a death in the family, she will make a meal and quietly deliver it to the family without being intrusive. She visits the sick at home, in the hospital or at a rehabilitation facility and is the favorite babysitter for family. She organizes fundraisers for people in need and brings attention to the needs of the poorest people in the parishes and neighborhoods.

Delores has been an active member of Division 3 for almost 50 years. She was the recipient of the New York State, 'Mother Teresa of Calcutta' Award in 2019 for "living her life by the guiding principles of our Order and in the spirit of Mother Teresa."

Delores not only believes in our motto of Friendship, Unity and Christian Charity, but she lives it as well. She has held many offices in the division, including the presidency, but is more comfortable behind the scenes wearing an apron. She and her husband were active members in their respective divisions and worked for the good of both orders, doing whatever needed to be done.
