I had the privilege of visiting <u>The National Shrine of Saint</u> <u>Elizabeth Ann Seton</u> in Emmitsburg, Maryland. It's a great way to spend a Fall day - - not crowded, and the grounds and surrounding countryside are beautiful. Emmitsburg is close to the Pennsylvania border and about 60 minutes from Baltimore.

First stop was the Visitors Center and Museum which recounted Mother Seton's life as a wife. mother, religious, widow, convert, educator, foundress, and Saint. Many of her possessions were donated to the Seton Shrine



by the Sisters of Charity. Among them are her bonnet, shawl, wedding ring, wedding broach, bible, letters, tea box, christening gown, locks of her hair, as well as the three letters testifying to the miracles attributed to her intercession. It was all very moving and by the end of it, I had a whim to enter the convent and open a Catholic school.

Second stop was a tour of the "Stone House" where Mother Seton lived when she arrived in Emmitsburg in 1809, followed by a tour of the "White House" that served as the first free Catholic school in America. Located nearby and surrounded by a high stone wall, is the St. Joseph Cemetery, where Mother Seton was first interred in 1829.

Saving the best for last, was the Basilica – so very beautiful and peaceful. And, sure enough, beneath the altar and enclosed in marble, are Mother Seton's remains.

I encourage you to go – you will be touched.
