We are hoping to be able to have brunch/meeting in June to try to get back on track.

In late January, the Ladies were thrilled to collaborate with Catholic Social Services of Bucks County to host their first community Diaper Driver. The Family Service Center is the first contact for individuals, families, and parishes when they seek assistance from Catholic Social Services. Due to the pandemic,

Catholic Social Services of Bucks County is experiencing a 30%

increase in need. Monthly, they serve on average 100 families and provide over 8,000 diapers. The Buck County Catholic Social Services offers Pregnancy and Parenting Support, Diaper Pantry, Mary's Food Cupboard,



collected over 6,600 diapers, 6,500 wipes, baby wash, and baby shampoo during three drop-off days.

This year we also hosted a PA Pick 3 Lottery Fundraiser for our SCHOLARSHIP FUND for two St. Mark 8th graders.

This was a huge success, we sold out in less than four days!
After the sunset on April 3rd, the Ladies decorated the lawns of twentyfive homes with eggs for Easter morning. They started to take orders for
"Egg My House!" about a month before the event and finished with over
700 plastic eggs filled with candies. It was a tremendous success

raising over \$500 and brought enjoyment to many children on Easter morning. It was a perfect way to embrace our motto of "Friendship, Unity, and Christian Charity."

HAPPY BELATED MOTHER'S DAY, IRELAND

Mother's Day in the United States of America will be celebrated on May 9, 2021. This began thanks to a American woman named Anna Jarvis holding a memorial service for her mother

on May 12, 1907.

Yearly Mother's Day traditions consist of attending mass as a mother or with your mother, grandmother or mother-in-law, purchasing/receiving cards, various gifts and celebrating dinner as a family. Carnations are a famous flower presented to a mother; pink or red for a living mother or white to honor a deceased mother. Why carnations, you may ask..... they represent the first celebration when Anna Jarvis delivered 500 carnations to a church in memory of her mother.

Again, why carnations.....because they were her mother's favorite flower.

On May 9, 1914, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day "a public expression of love and reverence for the mothers of our country".

Mother's Day in Ireland was celebrated on March 14, 2021,

always on the fourth Sunday of Lent, three weeks before Easter.

In past centuries and pre-WWII, it was known as "Mid-Lent Sunday" or "Mothering Sunday in Britain" and focused on individuals residing elsewhere returning to the "Mother (Baptismal) Church" to attend mass with their mother and family members. Today in Ireland and much of Europe, Mother's Day celebrations are similar to that of the United States, showering mothers, grandmothers and mothers-in-law with gifts, flowers and meals.

A child across-the-miles can easily honor their mother if unable to be with them by sending a card or by simply "making a phone call"!

I wish all mothers in the United States of America a heartfelt "Happy Mother's Day" and all mothers in Ireland, a belated Happy Mother's Day!!
