
PRAYER FOR HEALING

IRISH HISTORIAN

Spring has sprung right into our lives and will be bringing EASTER and greenery and flowers and hope and so this Spring Issue might be the right moment to re-live a very heartwarming, uplifting true story that takes us back to the year 1847.

The POTATO FAMINE is raging in Ireland and its people are starving and dying for their main staple -the potato - is rotting in the fields. On our continent the Choctaw Indians were suffering too. - in states such as Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana and Florida.- their last remaining home - the Choctaw were being forced to leave.

The law required that the government negotiate removal treaties so in the winter of 1831 under the threat of Army invasion the Choctaw people set out for a 500-mile journey to Oklahoma where they were to be resettled. The journey was made on foot, with some forced to walk in chains and with little to eat. The journey became known as "the trail of tears." Of the 21,000 Choctaw who began the journey half died from malnutrition, exposure and starvation.

Back to the Irish in the famine- the Irish here began relief funds for those in Ireland and one of the most unusual donations came from the Native American Choctaw Indian tribe - they assembled and gathered \$710, In today's money that would be approximately \$5,000.and they forwarded it to the United States Famine Relief Organization. They felt an affinity with the people of Ireland, who like themselves had suffered under a colonial power,

The Irish are not a people to forget such extraordinary kindness and generosity and therefore in 2015 erected a sculpture in County Cork to thank the Choctaw Indians The sculpture shows 9 Eagle Feathers standing 20 feet high to mark the Choctaw's kindness and support to the Irish in that bygone year of 1847.

The Sisters of St. Joseph still live and teach in St. Augustine and throughout the world today.

Later that night, we had a delicious dinner in **Unity** at the Raintree Restaurant where we had the opportunity to converse, dine, laugh and share stories with our fellow female Hibernians.

The trip culminated the next afternoon with tours of the Catholic Basilica of St. Augustine. If you have not yet been to this magnificent Spanish church, you really must see it to really appreciate it in all its glory. We ended our sojourn with a prayer of reflection/thanks led by our Florida State President, Louise Sullivan. POLITICAL EDUCATION COMMITTEE

You are invited to join the Political Education Committee April 16-21, 2023, on a trip to the St. Columban Border Mission in El Paso, TX and Juarez, Mexico.

The St. Columban Border Mission works with many other organizations and churches to advocate for migrants arriving through the Mexican border. The Mission provides a Border Awareness Experience that provides a first-hand look at the experience of migrants and the efforts of religious groups and other organizations to assist. There is more information on the Columban Border Experience at https://columbanjpe.org/border-awareness-program

A draft itinerary is included below. Some of the day trips will include helping out at a soup kitchen, visit to a Sisters of Mercy safe home for women, a visit to women & children's health center, a visit to a center for disabled children, a visit to border patrol and a tour/history of the area in El Paso around Sacred Heart Church, the area most affected by migration and a visit to the border fence. There will also be an opportunity to attend a weekday Mass in El Paso, within walking distance to the Mission.

The cost of the trip is \$110/day inclusive of all meals taken at the Mission, transportation, and translator for all day trips. An estimate for meals eaten outside of the Mission is approximately \$12/meal.

All members need to provide their own transportation to El Paso. I will be flying to El Paso and renting a car and can help with transportation from the El Paso airport to the Mission. Sleeping at the Mission is dormitory style. The biggest room sleeps six.

We will be making donations of cash at the various centers and organizations we visit. Travelers should bring cash donations if they would like to contribute. Some of the PEC travelers have received contributions from their divisions to help in this regard.

The PEC plans to make a video of the trip to help educate our LAOH Sisters on migration/immigration through a first-hand experience. Space is limited and we have 8 slots available. Please notify Gail Dapolito (laohnationalpoliticaledu@gmail.com) if you are interested in joining us. All monies should be submitted to Gail by the end of March.


