Dear Sisters,

I have been busy mentoring my Division in Allegheny County. In addition, I am still pouring my heart and soul into promoting Domestic Violence Awareness.

I was invited by Pittsburgh's President of City Council, Theresa Kail Smith, to attend the Council's Post Agenda on May 30 at 6 pm as a speaker concerning Domestic Violence Awareness and how Domestic Violence affects families, etc. I invite you, my friends, to attend the session in council chambers to support me and my mission of educating the community about how horrible this crime is against anyone in a domestic abuse relationship. Unfortunately, I couldn't prevent my daughter from murder, but maybe her voice and my message will affect another person to gain the strength to leave before they become another statistic and lose their life.

I am honored that the NY State LAOH Military Affairs invited me to be the guest speaker for military women concerning Domestic Violence. National Military Affairs Officer Cathy Dougherty is the organizer of this event. I am just waiting for the date to finalize everything.

Pittsburgh City and County Councilmen have agreed to take the Men Challenge Pledge. Very happy with this partnership on this topic.

I purchased 500 blankets and identified 13 Domestic Violence Shelters across the Commonwealth. Thus far, 70 blankets have gone to homeless veterans for transitions into their own homes, along with 30 blankets to the POWER organization for women with addiction transitioning to a clean life. My company Amazon PIT5 picked up my 7.5 pallets of blankets and paid for the packaging/shipment of 15 different entities.

Overall, I have been very busy the past two months!

My next venture is to raise \$10,000 to donate to these same entities with other items necessary to provide the help needed to all those affected. Colleen
