Pennsylvania Proud!

In June, our Pennsylvania Historian, Carole Cooney-Syzdek along with Mary Earnest, Cumberland County Division Historian, presented Elizabeth Howard her certificate and check for her Level II first place winning essay in the LAOH 2023 Irish History Contest. We were honored to have awarded Elizabeth at her highschool year end award ceremony. Fingers crossed Elizabeth's success inspires more students to participate!

In commemoration, a Memorial Mass was celebrated under the gallows in the Old Jail Museum on Saturday, June 17th, to remember those unjustly executed. Father Ronald Minner, who led us in prayer, reminded us, "Masses like this provide us the strength to move forward, seeking goodness,



Many men were convicted as Molly Maguires. Twenty-one men were hanged. On one single day, June 21, 1877, ten accused Molly Maguires were hanged. Four of those hangings took place at the same time in this Jail! That day is now remembered as "Black Thursday".

The gallows were erected at this end of the cell block. It contained two trap doors with two men standing on each door. The men on one door faced the men on the other trap door. They had white hoods placed over their heads before the hanging.

These hangings attracted many spectators. For the hanging of Rlexander Campbell, Michael Doyle, Edward Kelly and John Donohue on June 21, 1877, there were 185 people in the jail as witnesses. Newspapers stated that 485 tickets were issued for the hanging of Thomas P. Fisher on March 28, 1878.

In December 1993 a mock trial was held in the Carbon County Court House. At this trial Alexander Campbell was found innocent by an independent jury.

John "Black Jack" Kehoe, the miners' leader who was hanged in Pottsville in 1878 was granted a pardon by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in January 1979. even during trying times." Father was inspired to see the jail filled with so many people, " to see so many people herer to remember, people who have no other agenda than to remember and honor."
The Old Jail Museum, owned by the McBride and Dart families, along with their staff, so generously opens the jail to us each year. The AOH/LAOH of Division One Carbon County arranged the event,

including a lovely luncheon afterward.

As many of us sat in this most solemn location, we all felt the presence

of Alexander Campbell, John Donohue, Michael Doyle, Edward Kelly, Thomas P. Fisher, James McDonnell, and Charles Sharp, the men held in Cells 11-14. We witnessed the handprint, which proclaims their innocence. Father Minner encouraged us all to remember their names. He prayed that

this remembrance would inspire us to have the courage and tenacity to fix wrongs, to pull upon the strength of God inside of us, and work to make the world a little better, by starting at the local level.













On Tuesday, June 27th, our very own Colleen Bowers, former State President and member of Division 11, spoke at the City of Pittsburgh Council Meeting. Colleen shared the story of her beloved daughter Melissa,



who she lost due to domestic abuse. We are so proud of Colleen and her tireless campaign to make people aware of this horrible abuse and encourage people to help make it stop.

These important goals, ideas and principles of the Ladies Ancient Order of Hibernians have attracted Irish women of all walks of life and continue to do so."

Missions & Charity Sister Kathlan Smith D

Missions & Charity ~ Sister Kathleen Smith, RSM

Thank you for placing your trust in me as our State Missions and Charities officer. It has been a great privilege to do so for the past two years. I am grateful to have had the opportunity to facilitate our membership's on-going support of the Columban Fathers and Sisters. My admiration for the Worldwide Columban Missions has swelled.

The 24 months have speedily come to an end! Transitions are like crossing a threshold—one foot in what's grown familiar is becoming the familiar past and the other foot already stretched out toward the future. As an organization, we are not strangers to our two-year leadership cycle transitions.

As we prepare to step across the 2023 threshold, I, a Hibernian Mercy Sister whose order was founded in Dublin, Ireland, invite you to ponder a quote from our Foundress, an 18th Century Irish born woman: "Our hearts can always be centered in God, for whom alone, we go forward or stay back" (Catherine McAuley, Foundress of the Sisters of Mercy, Dublin, Ireland, 1831).

For me, this quote gives purpose and meaning to the crossing of a new threshold! As does our motto: Faith, Unity, and Christian Charity. As we embark on a new State Board of Officers, let's renew our commitment to support them, especially during their learning curve weeks.

Being your State Mission and Charities officer afforded me the momentum to learn more about the Columban Missionaries and, more significantly, the Columban Sisters. Being a vowed religious woman of an order founded in Ireland, I naturally felt drawn to investigate where and when the Columban Sisters originated.

The first Columban -Mercy connection was that every September 29th, the Columban Sisters celebrate the Anniversary of their Foundation as a Congregation. September 29th is the date Catherine McAuley, our Mercy Foundress, was born. A second connection was that Frances Maloney, the Columban Sisters Foundress, afterward known as Sister Mary Patrick, attended general nurses training at the Sisters of Mercy's Mater Hospital in Dublin.

The Ancient Order of Hibernians' patron saint is Saint Brigid. On the feast of Saint Brigid 2022, the Columban Sisters began preparations for their 100th Anniversary as a congregation by gathering in Cahiracon, a small coastal village and townland in County Clare, Ireland, near the banks of the Shannon River. It was on the feast day of Saint Brigid in 1922, that the first group of women came together in a farmhouse in Cahiracon, beside the River Shannon in County Clare, Ireland, to begin their novitiate and training as missionary sisters.

On Saint Brigid's feast day in 2022, the Columban Sisters gathered once again at Cahiracon. Their Congregational leader, Sister Susanna Choi, declared: "Today is the beginning of the preparation of

our century, and until the centenary of our Foundation Day on the 29th of September 2024, let us continue to rejoice and celebrate with grateful hearts."

In fully living their Columban Spirituality, the Columban Sisters pledge to be witnesses of God's compassion and love wherever they are. "Touched and set on fire by God's love, which is the source of our charism, we are called and sent in a spirit of compassion and solidarity to our fast-changing world." (Columban Spirituality)



I hope as LAOH members, we, too rejoice and celebrate God's love with

grateful hearts wherever we are! May we always continue to support and be inspired by the Columban Missionary Sisters as they celebrate their centenary.

Sister Peggy was a member of the Sisters of Divine Providence in Pittsburgh, PA.

She was the youngest member of the Order to become a Principal of St. Peter and Paul School in Beaver County, PA until her death.

Sister was also the Chaplain of the LAOH, Allegheny County and loved by all.

She was elected State Chair of Catholic Action before her untimely death and served us well.
