


Journalism Trailblazer to take the helm at 2024 St. Patrick's Day Parade

Betsy Ross is a name well known in Cincinnati Broadcasting and for her international sports coverage. Ross graced the airwaves at WCPO and WLWT news for years and now she will be taking on the role of Honorary Grand Marshall for the 2024 Cincinnati St. Patrick's Day Parade. "I am so looking forward to being the Grand Marshal," exclaimed Ross! "There have been so many distinguished Cincinnatians who have served that role, from historic Irish families to Kenny Anderson. I am truly honored to now be a part of the history."

Making history is not unusual to the Indiana native. Growing up near Connersville and later graduating from Ball State and Notre Dame, the television journalist and entrepreneur is well known for her time in front of the camera in the tri-state, but she is also well known globally. It was during a stint covering the Olympics for WLWT that ESPN took notice and Ross found herself relocating to Bristol. Connecticut, and the coveted ESPN anchor desk. At that time, it was not a spot not traditionally held by a woman. There is no doubt Ross' leadership and professionalism there opened doors for women to follow in sports journalism.
