



Centennial Commemoration of the Nuns of the Battlefield Monument

On the weekend of September 20th, many Sisters gathered in Washington, D.C., to commemorate the Centennial Commemoration of the Nuns of the Battlefield Monument while unveiling a new marker that, too, the LAOH sponsored.

Through the efforts of Ellen Jolly, a determined, wonderfully strong leader and President of our organization, the monument was dedicated on September 20, 1924. On the face of the granite monument is a bronze base relief panel picturing twelve nuns. The inscription above says:

THEY COMFORTED THE DYING, NURSED THE WOUNDED, CARRIED HOPE TO THE IMPRISONED, GAVE IN HIS NAME A DRINK OF WATER TO THE THIRSTY."

In 1914, having heard the stories of the battlefield nuns for years, Ellen Jolly proposed a monument to

honor the work of these selfless females, many of whom were Irish. Initially, the War Department turned down her proposal, citing a lack of written evidence to support the nuns' role during the war. Jolly spent many years compiling what would become one of the first substantial bodies of knowledge about female Catholic nurses on the battlefield. Finally, on March 29, 1918, Congress approved the creation of the sculpture but stipulated that it would not be government-funded. Again, Ellen Jolly was

instrumental in raising the funding, leading a committee that

raised \$50,000.(excerpt from our Sister Kathleen!)

The marker, an idea from former National President Marilyn Madigan, further highlights the selfless contributions of the nuns during the American Civil War many years back. A member of the design team, Marily and the team created an interactive experience for those seeking to deepen their understanding of this pivotal moment in American history.






While in DC, the Ladies spent some time at The Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, North America's largest Catholic church building.




The Ladies visited the the Brigid of Ireland Chapel which the LAOH donated and Bishop Shahan dedicated on September 24, 1927.

147th Rope Mass ~ Old Jail Museum, Jim Thorpe

On Saturday, June 15th, Sisters and Brothers, along with other proud Irish Americans, gathered at the Old Jail Museum to commemorate the passing of the Molly Maguires. Division One, Molly Maguires, once again hosted the moving Mass and a lovely luncheon.

In commemoration, a Memorial Mass was celebrated under the gallows in the Old Jail Museum on Saturday, June 15th, a solemn and significant event to remember those unjustly executed. Father Ronald Minner, who led us in prayer, reminded us, "Carry the cross, do what is right. We must all help to instill peace and defend what is right as small acts can create big unexpected differences." Father challenged everyone, "Pledge to pray and support one another, to forgive ~ even those who don't deserve forgiveness; this will help us all work for the common good as the Molly Maguire did." The Old Jail Museum, generously opened to us yearly by the McBride family and their staff, is a testament to their kindness and support. As many of us sat in this most solemn location, we all felt the presence of Alexander Campbell, John Donohue, Michael Doyle, Edward Kelly, Thomas P. Fisher, James McDonnell, and Charles Sharp, the men held in Cells 11-14. We witnessed the handprint proclaiming their innocence and were inspired to accept and embrace Father Minner's challenge.

Goodwin, for organizing this fun night!






Division # 3~ Maire Drumm ~ Montgomery County




